## Press Conference Regarding Texas Legal Aid Funding Concerns and Legislative Solutions <u>Wednesday, Feb. 18</u>

AUSTIN, Texas—Representatives from the Texas Access to Justice Commission, the Texas Access to Justice Foundation and Texas Supreme Court Chief Justice Nathan Hecht will hold a press conference at 1 p.m. on Wed., Feb. 18, to discuss funding concerns related to the Texas legal aid system. Due to a lack of resources, only about 20 percent of the civil legal needs of eligible Texans are currently being met.

The **Texas Access to Justice Commission** was created in 2001 by the Supreme Court of Texas to develop and implement policy initiatives designed to expand access to and enhance the quality of justice in civil legal matters for low-income Texans. The **Texas Access to Justice Foundation**, created by the Supreme Court of Texas in 1984, is the largest state-based funding source for the provision of civil legal aid in Texas.
